Invasive Plant Species: Autumn Olive *Elaegnus umbellata* Thunb.

Appearance: *Elaeagnus umbellata* is a deciduous shrub from 3-20 ft. in height with thorny branches. It is easily recognized by the silvery, dotted underside of the leaves.

Foliage: Leaves are alternate, 2-3 in. long and 1 in. wide. The margins are entire and undulate. Leaves are bright green to gray green above and silver scaly beneath with short petioles.

Flowers: Small, yellowish tubular flowers are abundant and occur in clusters of 5 to 10 near the stems from February to June.

Fruit: Fruits are round, red, juicy drupes which are finely dotted with silvery to silvery-brown scales. Each drupe contains one seed. Fruits ripen from August to November.

Ecological Threat: *Elaeagnus umbellata* invades old fields, woodland edges, and other disturbed areas. It can form a dense shrub layer which displaces native species and closes open areas. *Elaeagnus umbellata* is native to China and Japan and was introduced in North America in 1830. Since then, it has been widely planted for wildlife habitat, mine reclamation, and shelterbelts. It is a non-leguminous nitrogen fixer.
