News from Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station

To prevent the introduction of boxwood blight, caused by the fungus

Calonectria pseudonaviculatum, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has implemented a quarantine, effective as of its publication on Friday 24 June 2016.

Regulated articles include the fungus itself, along with any material or object that may carry or spread it, such as:

- All plants or plant parts (including **boxwood and pachysandra**);
- Brush, debris, bark, or yard waste;
- Landscaping, nursery/greenhouse, and plant retail waste;
- Leaves, branches, and soil of infected *Buxus* genus;
- Any other article that may present a risk of disseminating boxwood blight;

These articles may not be transported into or within PA unless done in accordance with the provisions of the guarantine, as follows.
