"State Representative Mary (Sherry) Fritz, 78, of Yalesville, loving wife of 52 years to William W. Fritz, passed away Saturday, July 9, 2016 at her home with her family by her side. She was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts on May 8, 1938, a daughter of the late Patrick and Kathleen (Kerns) Sherry. Mary attended Emanuel College, Boston College, Trinity College, and Fairfield University. She taught in the Wallingford Public Schools from 1959-1964. She was the founder of Create & Play Nursery School and taught reading in Meriden Parochial Schools. She was manager of Fritz's

Custom Furniture, was president of the PTA Yalesville School, and was Chairwoman of the Wallingford Board of Education. Mary was the State Representative of the 90th District for 32 years, was Deputy Speaker of the House for 8 years and was an advocate for her constituents. She was an avid quilter and Annalee collector, and loved to vacation on Lake Winnipesaukee for 40 years. Most of all, she was a pillar of the community who touched many lives and gave her heart and soul to everything she championed. In addition to her husband are 6 children, William W.
