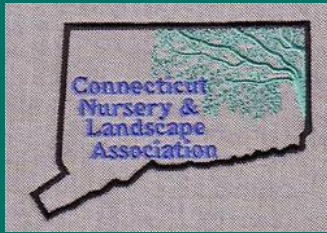
Space is Still Available at Invasive Plant Symposium!



Please join us for an Invasive Plant Symposium: "*Invasive Plants 2014: Where Are We Now?*", which will be held at the **UConn Student Union in Storrs, CT** on **Tuesday, October 7, 2014 from 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.** The symposium will be presented by the Connecticut Invasive Plant Working Group (CIPWG). People with all levels of interest and experience are invited to attend.

The Keynote Address will be given by Dr. Sarah Reichard, Professor and Director of the University of Washington Botanic Gardens, who will present, "Five-year Target: A down-to-earth vision bridging policy, research and management". Additional morning presentations will include opening remarks by State Senator Clark Chapin, legislative updates from the Connecticut Invasive Plants Council, and tips for contracting invasive plant control.

NENA Young Nursery Professionals Award & CNLA Award of Merit

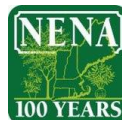
Make your nominations now for the **CNLA Award of Merit**. This is CNLA's highest award that honors the recipient for services to CNLA or the nursery industry.

- *and has portrayed a positive image of the nursery industry to the public*

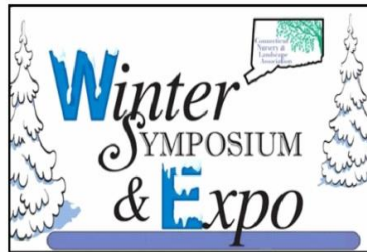

Experimental Drug Could Potentially Help The Fight Against Ebola



ZMapp is the name of the experimental drug that could put an end to the Ebola outbreak. This drug was first tested on 18 monkeys that were injected with the Ebola virus and all survived after consuming it. Many were skeptical if the drug would be effective on humans. The two American aid workers that were stricken with Ebola received ZMapp, recovered, and have been discharged from the hospital.

This drug is produced in genetically engineered tobacco plants; however, the supply is exhausted. It takes months for more of the drug to be produced and the remaining supplies have been distributed to those in need. [Click Here](#)
